For more than 22 years, Region 1 of the Associated Schools of Construction (ASC) has held an annual student competition and faculty conference. Students from over 15 schools from Maine to Virginia compete in this 2-day event. Region 1 holds the following three competition divisions:

- Commercial Building
- Design-Build
- Heavy-Highway

Each two-part competition is sponsored by a different company. On the morning of the first day, the sponsoring company provides each team with a proposal request from one of their current or completed projects.

The teams (six students each) are required to prepare bids, develop schedules, consider value-engineering options, develop safety, quality and cost control procedures, respond to addenda and react to phone quotes from fictitious subcontractors/vendors. The overall goal is to simulate a real-world bid development and or construction management proposal. All written work must be submitted by midnight Friday.

Saturday the student teams make an oral presentation to the judging representatives from the sponsoring company. They defend their bids, schedules, the 'means and methods' they propose to use on the project, their site-specific safety plans, and in the case of the construction management and design-build competitions, attempt to 'sell' their Construction Management and Design services to the sponsoring firm.

At the conclusion of the 2nd day's events, the sponsoring firms conduct a "debriefing" informing the students how the actual project

was constructed as well as allowing for a question and answer period about the project.

Finally, the winning teams are announced after dinner during an awards/recognition ceremony.

BECOME AN ACTIVE ASC REGION 1 MEMBER AND COMPETITION SPONSOR

Sponsoring companies design and judge the competition and see the first-hand work of the teams.

Companies are asked to provide the \$2,000 First Prize for their category, fund a meal, and commit to a three year term.
